

CAPE COD & NEWPORT

Welcome to the sandy shores of Cape Cod. Extending some 70 miles into the sea, the Cape is home to natural beauty and quaint colonial villages. Stroll pristine beaches and revel in the arts and culture of this gorgeous region!

1// Hyannis, MA Hop aboard our flight to make our way towards "bean town". We'll check into our hotel and then enjoy an included **dinner** to get to know the rest of your fellow travelers.

2 // Hyannis, MA Your local guide will meet you at your hotel for a full day of touring. Travel the historic Old King's Highway, a scenic byway winding through centuries of Cape Cod history. View a windmill, a Cape Cod lighthouse and visit the Cape Cod National Seashore Visitor's Center. Sand dunes and the ocean surround you as you approach "Land's End" -Provincetown, Board an excursion vessel for an amazing whale watching experience with an onboard naturalist to answer any of your questions about the wildlife and sights you may see. You may choose to stay on dry land instead and ride along the shoreline of the protected lands of the Cape Cod National Seashore on an optional one-hour dune tour. Your guide will point out the "dune shacks" where famous artists and writers became inspired to create their art.

3 // Hyannis, MA Grab some breakfast at your hotel before you are met by your guide and escorted to board the ferry to Nantucket Island. Take a tour of the Island and spend the day exploring the charming restaurants, galleries, shops, and museums. Dinner will be included this evening.

4 // Hyannis, MA Today we will return to the Hy-Line docks once again, except this time the ferry will whisk us away to beautiful Martha's Vineyard! Board a local bus for a Down Island sightseeing tour. Learn about the history and lifestyles of the islanders as you pass through Vineyard Haven. There will be free time for lunch and shopping in the historic whaling town of Edgartown. Complete your day on the island in Oak Bluffs. You may choose to stroll through "Cottage City" with its brightly painted cottages and decorative "gingerbread" trim. Then we will make our way back to Hyannis for our final overnight stay in Massachusetts.

5 // **Middletown, RI** This morning we'll check out of the hotel and start our drive to the "Ocean

State" of Rhode Island. Embark on a narrated tour of Newport where you'll enjoy the charm of Newport's historic buildings and restored homes covering over 150 points of interest. Then take in the rugged beauty of Ten-Mile Ocean Drive and the fabulous mansions along tree-lined Bellevue Avenue, Enjoy free time for lunch on the historic downtown waterfront filled with cobblestone shopping wharves lined with antique stores, art galleries, specialty shops and restaurants. Next, take a self-guided tour of the Marble House. Built between 1888 and 1892 for Mr. and Mrs. William K. Vanderbilt, it was a summer house, or "cottage", as Newporters called them in remembrance of the modest houses of the early 19th century. Follow that up with another self-guided tour of the Breakers Mansion. The Breakers is the grandest of Newport's summer "cottages" and a symbol of the Vanderbilt family's social and financial preeminence in turn of the century America. **Dinner** is included this evening at your hotel.

6 // West Haven, CT Our adventure is nearing its end, but there are still many stops remaining! First off, tour the Mystic Seaport Museum and Old Mistick Village. This beautiful immersive museum celebrates and honors the rich maritime history of the area, and the Old Mistick Village provides many options for shopping and food! This afternoon we will board the Essex Steam Train & Riverboat. The Valley Railroad Company has been operating since 1971 and they are keeping the rich mechanical, industrial,
